Mayor Dave Hutchinson and City Administrator David Cline have asked to address the Board of Trustees at our June meeting to provide us with an update on the city's plan to address the flooding in our neighborhood and to discuss/explain the new speed camera system recently installed near Brookside.

There has been some discussion about renovating the cabana. After many years of use it has definitely seen better days. Before any decision is made on whether to proceed and -- if we do renovate -- what the new cabana should look like, the board is seeking input from the community. Do you think we should spend money to renovate the cabana? The electrical system needs to be upgraded so that two coffee pots won't pop the circuit breaker. Should a new cabana have a sink and basic plumbing? Keep in mind we are not able (because of legal limitations) to change the basic footprint or location of the current cabana. Please feel free to share your opinions and comments with me or any board member. The board hopes to prepare a presentation concerning this issue for the next general meeting in November.

Finally, as you receive your new Sheridan Beach Club directory, please take a moment to review your information. If it is inaccurate, please let me know so we can make changes to the online version.

Pool Committee

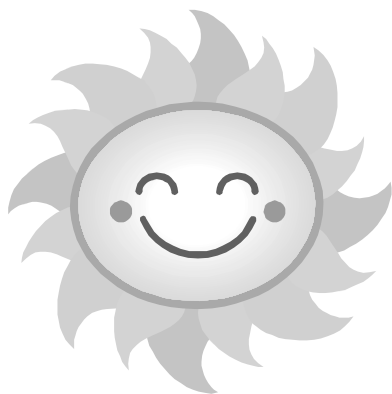

SBCC Board Meeting Minutes

March 11, 2009

Members Present: M Vanderveen, J McFarland, B Sharkey, E Hausman, N Knutson, M Jaeger, S Singler, M Feinberg, F Anderson, D Born, B Dodson, A Potter, D Cassidy, C Standaert

Meeting called to order: 7:07, Approved the minutes for February 2009 meeting.

Correspondence: No report.

President's Report: Dan Cassidy has obtained 4 bids to re-plaster the pool. He is in the process of trying to decide which bid will give us the best value for the money. It was requested by the LFP mayor and other elected officials that Mark Vanderveen provide a letter of support to lobby the federal government for funds to address the flooding problems in Sheridan Beach with McAleer Creek and Lyon Creek.

Treasurer's Report (Eric Hausman): Updated invoice design with a new section on the back to gather personal information for a centralized database. The financial statements will be mailed later this month. The Treasurer discussed the cost savings of emailing vs mailing The Shouter. Mark Vanderveen offered to post messages in the Shouter and on the Beach Club website, in an attempt to encourage more members to receive it by email. The Treasurer reported that the Sheridan Beach federal tax return was prepared by George Jonson's accounting firm.

New Business: The President reviewed a letter sent to him by attorney, David Tingstad. regarding nuisance issue related to a noise complaint by a member of the SB Homeowners Association. Board discussed Covenants Conditions & Restrictions with regard to reasonable use of the clubhouse and pool.

Old Business: The Board discussed concerns regarding Dodson's view of the newly installed solar panels. The Board shared ideas for developing a design criteria process for new projects going forward.

Pool/Swim Team Report (Jessica McFarlane/ Dan Cassidy): Staff requested we change the morning swim hours by 15 minutes. Current hours are 5:45-7:15. Dan finalized analysis of the bids to re-plaster the pool. Best value is expected to be Cascade Pool Works. Timing on the project would be 4/15—5/13. The board voted to move forward with Cascade Pool Works contract. Dan then reviewed issues regarding ventilation & air circulation with the water heaters and pumps. The Board discussed the possibility of remodel on the cabana. Mark will schedule meeting with Dan & Fritz for further discussion.

Membership: (Mark Jaeger): 3 posted applicants (& sponsors) in Shouter to be considered as potential members. 3 more applications recently submitted. Membership will post these in next Shouter.

Beach: (Fritz Anderson): Big hedge clean-up on the street in a few weeks. The Board discussed goose round- up again this year & possibility of cabana remodel. Easter Egg Hunt beach clean up, April 4th, 10:00-1:00. Work party days are May 9th and 16th. Pool opens May 23rd.

Capital Improvements: (Bill Dodson): No report.

Public Safety: (Barbara Sharkey): Coyote sighting in the community. Mark spoke to the community examiner and we are keeping the stop sign in our community. Discussion regarding the Lake Ballinger water shed and a list of suggestions for down stream flooding, maybe increasing culverts. The city will address a strategic plan for storm and surface water flow issues for the Lyon Creek Watershed.

Covenants: (Don Born): No report.

Sailing Club: Eric Hausman): Club recently met and decided to increase Sailing Club dues.

Special Events: (Alison Potter): Members have suggested we have bathrooms available for the Easter Egg Hunt. Board agrees to fund a Port-a-Potty.

Communications: (Nowelle Knutson): No report
